Math

Daily Warm-Up:

Task #1 - Grab a piece of paper and some crayons or markers. Draw a picture of yourself in your camp uniform. Since you are going to Camp Mathematician, perhaps you can add patterns, numbers, and/or shapes? Be creative!

Task #2 - You will need to be prepared for Camp Mathematician! You will be there for two weeks. Make a list of all of the items you will need to bring with you. For example, how many pairs of pajamas, shorts, and socks will you need? How many items will you bring with you in total? Making a tally may help you to count faster!

Task #3 - Create a model of what your cabin will look like using popsicle sticks and a glue gun (you will need a parent to help you!) What 2D and 3D shapes can you find in your cabin? You may also wish to draw a blueprint of what your cabin looks like on the inside! Have fun!

Daily Warm-Up:

- Don't forget to write a sentence telling about your new picture.

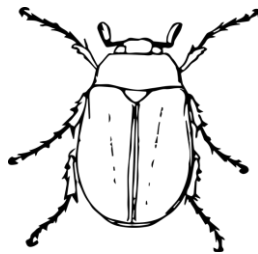


(this is a great time to use a jar, filled with water, as a magnifying glass!)

Draw and make a list of insects you see outside. Which one is your favorite?

Why is it your favourite? Which one is your least favorite? Why?

Don't forget to notice the size, colour, shape, and habitat of each bug.



1. Parents: write Sight Words on cards and hide them around the yard. (a, and, the, that, to, in, it, is, on, was, I, of, he, she)
2. Have your child "hunt" for them. Wearing sunglasses or using a pointer, flyswatter, or magnifying glass adds a "cool" factor to this game!
3. Students keep the cards that they can read within 3 seconds - that's the "sight word" rule.
4. Words that cannot be read in 3 seconds can be taught and hidden again, in a smaller space.
5. Continue until all the cards are found.
