#### RES' Safe & Positive Learning Environment

<u>District 16's NO BUS TRANSFER Policy</u>: To ensure the safety of all RES students who travel on either District 16 or District 11 school buses, **Rexton Elementary's NO BUS TRANSFER policy** will be strictly adhered to even during the hustle-and-bustle of the upcoming Christmas season. This policy is intended to provide security to our 260 students, 25 bus drivers and 30 teaching staff. On any given day we could have a number of substitute teachers, bus drivers, and/or administrative staff who might not be aware of the intricacies of our transportation system. Rexton Elementary only provides bus transfers for authentic <u>emergencies</u>.


We encourage all parents to make arrangements with a family member or friend to meet their child at his/her regular bus stop when they are unable to be there when their child arrives home from school. Please refer to page 3 of our Student Agenda for further clarification on RES' NO BUS TRANSFER policy.



<u>Supervision Starts @ 8 a.m.</u> — Recently, we have noticed that some of our students are being left unsupervised in front of our school in the minutes before supervision begins at RES. A reminder that children under the age of 12 are too young to be left unattended and supervision at RES does not begin until 8:00 a.m.

Have Your Child Ride on the Bus: If at all possible, we encourage all parents to avoid picking-up their children prior to dismissal; we are still conducting "business-as-usual" at this time of year and pulling your child out of class for shopping trips, hair appointments, etc. can be extremely disruptive to your child's classmates.

No Parking Signs: are placed in front of our school to protect our very young students, many of whom are not tall enough to see a car zooming into our entrance. Parking between our no parking signs, parking in our handicap zone and/or drop-off zones is strictly prohibited.



<u>Visitor's Pass:</u> With the large number of visitors entering our school building during the upcoming Christmas season, we must be even more vigilant about who is in our building. Therefore, all visitors to RES are required to sign-in at our office, ask to obtain a visitor's pass before proceeding past our lobby, and sign-out before they leave our


