Melting snow often results in puddles of water on our school floors and so it is also very important that all students have a pair of indoor shoes that they can wear whilst inside and that can be kept in their locker throughout the school day.




### RES' 2010 Anti-Bullying Day

It is expected that all students in New Brunswick's public school system attend school regularly, arriving on time for class and remaining for the entire school day. Parents are reminded that when their child is unable to attend school, that they are to notify the school as soon as possible. When the child returns to school after being absent, parents are expected to send in a written, dated excuse to the child's teacher that includes the child's name, the date the child was
