# CRITICAL SAFETY REMINDERS

Due to the mountain-high snowbanks in Rexton Elementary's entry way, it is crucial that all parents/staff/visitors be reminded of RES' safety procedures:

Take Note

- Drivers who enter our school building, MUST park their vehicles in RES' parking lot (NOT in front of our school OR in RES' Drop-Off Zone).
- RES' Drop-Off Zone is only to be used if you are dropping off your child (it's our Kiss & Drive Away zone). PLEASE DO NOT PARK IN OUR DROP-OFF ZONE. (this procedure is applicable both in the mornings and in the afternoons).
- If you are dropping off your child in our Drop-Off Zone PLEASE insist that your child exits from the left-hand side of your vehicle (right onto the sidewalk NOT in the line of bus/vehicle traffic).



- When you drive into our school entry-way and want to drop-off your child, please remember to drive up to the top of the Drop-Off Zone thus permitting others to park behind you (otherwise your vehicle might be preventing our busses, other parents, and staff from entering our entry-way).
- 5. DRIVE VERY CAUTIOUSLY & SLOWLY when you are driving into our school entry-way... adults are able to see around obstacles far more than our small children can!
