



No Sports & Energy Drinks @ RES

Energy drinks contain caffeine, the amino acid taurine, sugar, and may contain herbs such as guarana and yerba mate which also increase the caffeine content. Caffeine is known to cause anxiety, nervousness, irritability, and insomnia. It can affect blood pressure and heart rate. At higher doses, it can cause delirium, neuromuscular tremors, and convulsions (Health Minister Hugh Flemming, May 1, 2013). According to New Brunswick's Nutrition Policy 711, sports and energy drinks are not to be sold or offered in provincial schools; Rexton Elementary students are not permitted to bring these types of drinks in their lunches.

Help Your Child "Do-the-Math"



We use **measurement** to determine the height, length, width and volume of objects. We measure time and money. Developing the ability to estimate and to measure accurately takes time and practice. The following are suggestions (from the following website:

http://www.edu.gov.on.ca/eng/document/brochure/earlymath/#activities) of how parents may help their children develop measurement skills:

Estimate Everything: # of steps from the door to the edge of the yard, time needed for a trip

- to the ice-cream store, or the # of stars he/she can draw in a minute!
- B) Compare and Organize Household Items: from tallest to shortest
- Talk About Time: including digital/analogue clocks and the calendar.
- Include your child in activities that involve measurement: helping with recipes, cooking supper, building things or simply counting money.
