<u>Hand-Sanitizers for RES:</u> For your information, our school has ordered hand-sanitizers for each of its classrooms & heavy-traffic areas within our learning environment to prevent the spread of germs amongst students/staff. RES teachers have been and will continue to teach/monitor proper hygiene techniques with all of its students (hand-washing, sneezing into ones sleeve, encouraging proper rest & exercise, and opening our windows daily to allow for the flow of fresh air to ribbon through our school building.

<u>School Pedometer Challenge 2009-2010:</u> Rexton Elementary if very pleased to announce that our school will be one of two schools within School District 16 to participate in the provinces' School Pedometer Challenge! The objective of the School Pedometer Challenge is to use pedometers as a tool to increase motivation, as a means of creating a culture of physical activity in schools and school communities. The program is designed to educate school-aged children and others in their school community regarding the benefits of a healthy active lifestyle.

As a selected school, RES will receive several sets of pedometers, resources full of information and ideas to help make pedometers effective with our students, staff and community members in a variety of ways. The pedometers will be used in the classroom, before or after school, during recess and at lunch time.

Presently a total of 48 schools are successfully participating in the School Pedometer Challenge throughout the province. We anticipate that these pedometers will help promote healthy and active lifestyles with RES students and staff.



RES' Safe & Positive Learning Environment

Peanut/Nut, Shellfish, and Egg-Safe Environment:

RES is very appreciative for the ongoing support of its parents, staff, and students in collaborating with us to closely monitor our children's lunches/snacks to ensure that all food items are allergen-safe. Bus Safety:

Rexton Elementary has completed its Bus Safety/Evacuation Drills for the 2009-2010 school year. A gentle reminder that for safety reasons:

- 1) Eating while traveling on one of our provincial school buses is prohibited, and
- All students are expected to conduct themselves in a respectful manner whilst enjoying the privilege of traveling on our provincial school buses.



Lockdown Drills: On Friday, October 2nd, RES successfully completed its annual school-wide Lockdown Drill. We will be conducting a surprise Lockdown Drill in the very near future BUT, once again, parents will be notified by written notice and Talk-Mail message the day before our Lockdown Drill. A reminder that all visitors to our school need to sign-in at the office and obtain a visitor's pass before entering into our school hallways. We are teaching our students to be very observant of "strangers" who are not a wearing an visitor's pass when they are in RES' learning environment. A heartfelt "thank-you" to all parents/guardians for supporting RES' endeavors to ensure that our school continues to be a safe and positive learning environment.

School Parking/Drop-off Handicapped Zone, Bus Loading Zone Procedures:

As we all settle into another school year at Rexton Elementary we need to provide gentle reminders to all parents/guardians about the seriousness of following our bus loading & drop-off zones procedures. Every school day, well over 20 school buses (from two school districts), scores of parents driving their children to school, AND approximately 40 staff members enter our school's drop-off & parking lot areas. This results in RES having a very intense traffic situation in front of our school daily! Therefore, we need all visitors to: a) use the "drop-off & handicapped parking zones" as they were intended, b) ENTER & EXIT using the appropriate driveways, and c) avoid driving/parking in our Bus Loading Zone. The areas that have been clearly marked with bright yellow markings (parallel to our drop off zone) are also NO PARKING areas. Of course, the reason for having to create these NO PARKING areas is to prevent our young students from being injured.

We realize that most parents are in a rush to get to work every morning but PLEASE take the time to park your vehicle in our expanded parking lot if you require more time with your child before dropping him/her off at Rexton Elementary School!

Classes Begin at RES @ 8:30 a.m. sharp:

A reminder that morning supervision begins @ RES at 8:00 a.m. and students who arrive after 8:30 will be considered late for class (with the exception of those students traveling on a bus that arrives after 8:30 a.m.). Teachers are required to document, throughout the school year, all incidents of tardiness, absenteeism, and incidents of students being picked-up before dismissal. Parents who drop off their child(ren) late for class or who are picking their child up before dismissal are asked to stop by RES' office and sign their child in/out of our school building.

Department of Education's Kindergarten Surveys:

On Friday, October 2, RES' Kindergarten students took home a NB Department of Education survey that all Kindergarten parents are asked to complete and send back to the school as soon as possible. The surveys are intended to be anonymous but the Kindergarten teachers will be tracking which parents have returned their surveys. Once all the surveys have been returned to the school, we will send them back to the Department of Education.




We are pleased-as-punch AND very relieved to have our Librarian , Janice LeBlanc, back with us this school year!
