

Help Your Child "Do-the-Math"

- Be positive about math and show the real-life tasks that require YOU to use Math every, single day!
- Math
- 2. Encourage your child to use real objects or draw pictures to solve difficult math problems.
- 3. Play lots of games with your children or perhaps orchestrate a Family Game Night (Trouble, Chess, Card Games, games that involve using dice, etc.).
- 4. Ensure that you are working with your child regularly to help him/her develop the critical addition/subtraction or multiplying/division facts skills; these operational skills are just as important today as they were when you were a child. The expectation is that your child should be able to answer their grade level adding/subtracting or multiplying/division questions in 3 seconds or less!

Safety Reminders:

 All visitors (including familiar faces!) need to remember to check-in with the office upon arriving at our school. RES tries to strike a balance between being invitational whilst ensuring that we know who is in our building at all times.



Help Your Child LOVE Reading



Read to or with your child daily. Decades of research has shown that children excel academically when they read independently and with a caring adult daily.

Share your love of reading and conversation by talking with your child about the things you read online or in the newspaper.

Make connections with the movies your family watches by either chatting about the movie before/after watching it or if possible, reading the book before watching the movie!
