Changes for the 2009-2010 School

There have been a number of important changes at RES this year:

- District/provincial funding for RES' Accelerated Grade 3 class has been discontinued,
- 2) RES' **Grade 4** students will be involved in the provinces' **Pre-Intensive** French Program,
- 3) RES' Art instruction responsibilities will be shared between our Administrative team,
- 4) We have 2.5 fewer **Teacher Assistants** than last year,
- 5) We have a new cafeteria service provider: Chartwell
- 6) All students will have 30 minutes of curriculum-based physical education every day, (mandated by the Department of Education)
- 7) Students in grades 3-5 will be going outside to play during their morning recess,
- 8) All RES students and staff will be following a 5-day schedule this year, AND
- 9) Rexton Elementary has made significant changes to its homework policy.

RES' Safe & Positive Learning Environment

Peanut, Nut, Egg, Shellfish-Safe Environment:

Rexton Elementary has students who are allergic to peanuts, nuts, eggs and/or shellfish. In order to provide a safe environment for <u>all</u> our students, we are appealing to all parents to closely monitor their children's lunches/snacks (reading labels carefully) to ensure that their lunches/snacks are peanut/nut-free, containing no boiled eggs, egg salad/sandwiches, and/or shellfish.

Bus & Fire Evacuations Drills:

RES' classroom teachers and our Guidance counselor, Mr. Melanson, are currently working with students at all grade levels in learning the proper procedures whilst traveling on and evacuating from our school buses. We intend to begin **bus** evacuation drills during the week of September 21st.

Within the first month of school, RES students will participate in three **fire drills**; one drill was completed (very successfully) on Friday, September 11th and the other two will be unannounced and completed during the week of September 14th - 18th (weather permitting).

<u>Lockdown Drills</u>: We are required by the Department of Education to have a <u>Lockdown Drill every year</u>. **RES parents will be informed by notice/Talk Mail** the day before our lockdown drill. When our school is practicing a lockdown drill there will also be a notice on the front doors indicating why our doors are locked. We intend to have our first lockdown drill of the 2009-2010 school year before September 30th.

Before & After RES' Instructional Day: A "gentle" reminder that RES' school doors open to students and supervision of RES students begins at our fine, fine school at 8:00 a.m. sharp every weekday. Parents are reminder that dismissal for K-2 students is at 1:50 and our students in grades 3-5 are dismissed at 3:00.

<u>School Parking/Drop-off & Handicapped Zone:</u> Please note that RES' handicap parking spot in front of the school is for handicapped drivers only. We have two drop-off spots in front of the school and we thank you for using these spots as "Kiss & Drive Away" spots — not as parking spots. If you need more time with your child in the mornings when you arrive at our school, please park your vehicle in our parking lot. We sincerely thank-you for your ongoing consideration in regards to this very important safety matter.

<u>Starfish Program</u> — It's a brand-new school year and so that means that all RES students begin their school year as a RES Starfish! Those who exhibit strong character traits throughout the school year are eligible to be nominated as **RES**Sparkling Starfish and could possibly be celebrated as "Sparklers" at our schoolwide assemblies.

RES' New 2009-2010 Homework Policy

In the spring of 2009, many of RES teachers attended a presentation by educator and author, Alfie Kohn, entitled: *The Homework Myth* that convinced our elementary teaching team to reconsider its homework policy. By now, most parents have heard that RES has modified its homework policy for the 2009-2010 school year. The following is a list of factors, presented to our teachers by Mr. Kohn that helped to contribute to RES' new homework policy:

- "There is no academic benefit for assigning homework until high school
- RES staff made a conscientious decision to change from a test oriented school to a learning oriented environment.
- Research shows that you don't get an increase in achievement because of homework,
- 4) Assigning homework in an effort to have students "get-used-to-it" is not a developmentally appropriate practice for young students.
- We want our students to develop as human beings; there's more to development than academics. If children are not bombarded with homework, they will have more

- time for reading for pleasure to/with parents, their friends and PLAY (which is the real work of young children).
- All to often, homework is "busy-work". Learning is not about pouring stuff into kids.
- 7) Homework doesn't result in learning because it: a) is stressful, b) is frustrating and exhausting to the child and his/her parents, c) often causes family conflict, and d) is an extinguisher of curiosity.
- Homework often infringes on family-time unnecessarily; families should decide what happens during family time—not schools, and
- Finally, like adults, when our children get home from a hard day at work they too want to chill-out!" (Alfie Kohn, 2009)

Alfie Kohn stated that, better teachers don't need to assign homework. Thus... for the 2009-2010 school year, RES students/teachers will be collectively involved in an action-research project to determine whether not assigning nightly homework will increase student motivation and learning. RES teachers feel that

this decision will enable us to meet the educational needs of their students by focusing on best teaching practices and less on creating, assigning, and policing the completion of homework. Teachers will be focused on the mastery of concepts and not on assuming that their students have practiced/learned the concepts through reams of homework.

There are, however, certain conditions when RES students will be assigned homework:

- A) When a child is involved in a District/School Intervention (Reading Recovery, etc.),
- Preparing for school or provincial literacy or numeracy tests.
- C) When a child would benefit from extra practice in acquiring basic sight words and/or math facts
- For catching-up if s/he needs extra support or has missed time at school due to illness.
