RES' 2012-2013 School Year Update:

- 1) We have nineteen (19) teachers and eight (8) Educational Assistants,
- RES' has, for the first time, a Grade 5 French Immersion class,
- 3) We have two (2) Grade 3 French Immersion classes,
- French Second Language Assistant, Ginette Simard, will be facilitating our FSL students & teachers,
- 5) We have four (4) Literacy Clinicians (Nancy Scully, Lucie Brown, Sonya Tower, Karen Thibeault) & one (1) Numeracy Lead (Toby Daigle),
- 6) We have two First Nations Liaison Workers (Mona Francis & Shona Sark)
- 7) RES' Grades 2-5 students have Student Agendas,
- 8) RES has one UNB Student Intern this fall and one UNB Student Intern in the Winter of 2013.
- 9) Under the direction of the Anglophone North School District, student attendance will be tracked very closely this year. Parents of students who miss 5 days will be contacted by their child's homeroom teacher; greater than 5 days missed, without a valid reason, will result in having to meet with either school administrators or District personnel to establish an Attendance Contract, and
- 10) RES is now one of <u>34</u> schools within the provinces' newly formed Anglophone North School District!!

- Dismissal for K-2 students is at 1:50 and our students in grades 3-5 are dismissed at 3:05.

Helping to Ensure that RES is a Positive Learning and Working Environment:

All RES parents/guardians play an absolutely crucial role in ensuring that our students receive the best learning opportunities possible during the school year. Please continue to ensure that your child:

- 1. Arrives on time and if possible, remains at school for the entire instructional school day.
- 2. Brings a healthy recess snack and lunch everyday: NO JUNK FOOD PLEASE!
- 3. Completes and returns his/her assigned homework materials daily.
- 4. Remains at home if he/she is not feeling well and that you notify the school of his/her illness ASAP
- 5. Brings a note for his/her teacher if they will be picked up by a parent/guardian before dismissal or at the end of the day. Please be advised that numerous unexpected parents arriving at the end of the day can lead to delays at dismissal time, which in turn can cause our buses to leave our school later than usual; these delays often result in scores of phone calls from concerned parents who are worried about the whereabouts of their children. We encourage the use of our big, yellow buses!

Administrators: Our secretary is Ms. Carla Hudson. Ms. Carla's work day begins at 8 a.m. and ends at 4 p.m. and her scheduled lunch break every day is between 12:00-1:00. Also, parents wishing to meet with a school administrator during our instructional day are asked to please call the school to schedule an appointment. If you call to speak to an administrator and they are in class or in a meeting, every effort will be made to return your call as soon as possible. 



RES' 2012-2013 Homework Policy

- Parents are asked to please check their child's book bag nightly for messages and/or homework assignments.
- It is expected that all Rexton Elementary students will READ to his/her parent or guardian every night, whether it is a book, magazine, newspaper, website, comic book, ~ something the child enjoys!!



<u>K-2 Students</u>: may also receive homework that will require nightly practice with their parent/guardian (letter/word lists, Math flashcards, printing or writing, etc.)

<u>Grades 3-5 Students:</u> may receive homework 2-3 times a week (individual teachers will make this decision for/with their students).

- Rexton Elementary children may also be required to do additional homework in preparation for district or provincial assessments.
- Rexton Elementary students involved with Reading Recovery[™] or Literacy/Numeracy Interventions will have nightly homework assignments.
