In addition to our new Kindergartners, RES also wants to welcome our new grades 1-5 students (and their families) who moved into the Rexton-area during the summer months.



RES' Positive Learning Environment

Crucial Allergic Alerts:

It is critical that RES be a **peanut/nut**, **egg and shellfish-safe school**.

We encourage all parents to please check food labels carefully when shopping for groceries and when packing lunches.



School Parking/Drop-off & Handicapped Zone Reminders:

- 1. RES' handicap parking spot in front of the school is for disabled drivers only.
- 2. RES has two drop-off spots in front of the school and they are only to be

used as "Kiss & Drive Away" spots — not as parking spots. Parking in front of our school backs-up other vehicles attempting to enter our parking area (buses, other parents, and staff). If you require more time with your child in the mornings when you arrive at our school please park your vehicle in our parking lot.



Instructional Day:

- Supervision for RES' K-5 students begins every school day at 8:00 a.m.
- Dismissal for K-2 students is at 1:55. Dismissal for RES' Grades 3-5 students is at 3:10.
- All the end of each school day, parents of K-2 students must greet/signal to their child's bus driver when the bus arrives at their homes, otherwise the driver is required to return the child to the school and the parent will need to drive to the school to pick-up the child.
- Parents who arrive at our school to pick-up their child before dismissal need to wait until the students are dismissed unless they have sent a note to the child's teacher indicating the reason for the early dismissal (for an example, your child has a medical appointment). This procedure is necessary so as to not interrupt our learning environment, teacher's lesson, classroom procedures at the end of the school day, and our very busy office.
- Parents who do pick-up their child during or at the end of the day are required to come into our school and sign-out their child (we are unable to let our children go out into our very busy parking lot area without a supervising staff member or parent/quardian.
- RES' first priority is the safety of our students and the security of our building.

 Please note that all doors to our building are locked during the instructional day. In order to enter our building during the instructional day, visitors need to press the button on the outside of our front doors.



 In order to ensure the safety and security of our students all visitors (including parents & district staff) are required to obtain permission & a visitor's pass prior to going beyond our school lobby area ~ thank-you.

How to Help Your Child Have the Best Learning Day:

Please continue to ensure that your child:

- 1. Arrives on time and remains at school for the entire instructional school day.
- 2. Brings a healthy recess snack **and** lunch everyday: **Junk food items are not permitted**. Please note that RES does not offer a free-lunch program.
- 3. Completes and returns his/her assigned homework materials daily.
- 4. Remains at home if he/she is not feeling well; parents are asked to please notify the school as soon as possible when their child is ill.
- 5. Brings a note for his/her teacher if he/she will be picked up by a parent or guardian before dismissal OR at the end of the day. Please be advised that numerous unexpected parents arriving at the end of the day can lead to delays at dismissal time, which in turn can cause our buses to leave our school later than usual; these delays naturally result in scores of phone calls from concerned parents who are worried about the whereabouts of their children. We encourage all bus students to use of our big, yellow taxis (buses)!

Administration: Our secretary is Connie Agnew and her work day begins at 8 a.m. and ends at 4 p.m. Her lunch break is between 12:00-1:00. Also, parents wishing to meet with a school administrator during our instructional day are asked to please call the school (at 523-7152) to schedule an appointment. If you call to speak to an administrator and they are in class or in a meeting, every effort will be made to return your call as soon as possible.
